**Residencies offered:**

**Art a la Carte: “What are you hungry for ?”** This residency is designed to teach basic art skills and address curriculum through subject content. Residency length is dependent on projects selected. Projects could include but are not limited to:

- ❑ **Draw upon drawing** : sequential drawing lessons beginning with blind contour, gesture drawings, draw your friend – posing with props, draw your favorite object
- ❑ **Paper Power:** 2 and 3 dimensional units teaching curling, scoring, pleating, and coiling in 3-4 favorite themes: Full- ‘round paper sculpture, Paper bas-relief, Design a dragon, and Paper collage
- ❑ **Paint, Pastel, Pencil** – students explore color and manipulate multiple mediums. Projects include glue line scratch board, oil pastel resist, and a variety of paint on paper projects which are easily adapted to curricular content.
- ❑ **Giacometti sculptures:** in the style of this Italian sculptor, students will build tall gestural sculptures from wire on a wooden base. This can be easily completed in a foil wrap or expanded to a paper mache or plaster wrap finish.

- a note to teachers: .All of these units teach to the EALRS, and build confidence through learning art skills and vocabulary. My projects are simple, flexible and changeable according to classroom time restrictions and needs. I look forward to planning a unit of study best suited to you and your students.

**Preferred Age/Grade level:** K-8

**Supplies, Equipment, Space, and Time Considerations:** Most projects are based on readily available classroom art materials. Units usually require one hour sessions and can range from a single visit to building a relationship with students through classes spread through out the school year.
